The Anarchist Federation (AF) is the largest organisation of anarchist communists in Britain. We have groups in London, East Kent, Nottingham, Sheffield, Reading, Manchester, Preston, Hereford and Liverpool. We have individual members in many other towns and cities throughout Scotland, England and Wales. The AF is growing at the moment.

# **Class Struggle**

We believe that only the self-emancipation of the working class can liberate humanity from the shackles of exploitation and state domination. To that end we organise with other workers in our workplaces and communities. We are active, as militant rank and file workers, in the unions where we work. Many of us are members of the Industrial Workers of the World, a growing rank and file union in Britain. Our members organise in their communities to reclaim space from the domination of landlords and capital.

## Internationalism

As internationalists we are members of the International of Anarchist Federations (IAF-IFA). This federation is mostly based on organisations in France, Italy, Spain, Britain, Germany and Argentina. We meet every three months to co-ordinate activities and try to support anarchists in other parts of the world. The IFA is currently growing and we expect new federations to join at our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary Congress in Carrarra (Italy) later this year.
